# 1) Welcome by the President-John McMaster

John noted that this was our first general meeting since 2019 due to COVID and thanked everyone for coming today. John also thanked Mike Roman for arranging the space and lunch for our meeting.

4) Approval of the Minutes for general meeting November 3, 2019 -

## 5) Reports

## a) Treasurer's report - John Matkovich

Collected dues from 172 members (315 members in 1999). Expenses have been minimal. Cash balance \$8,161.15. Submitted Treasurers Report.

b) National Director's report (AWC) -Doug Markin -

Ontario plans to host the AWC Competition in the fall of 2023. Most likely only BC, Ontario and Nova Scotia will host future AWC competitions. After the BCAWA Provincial Competition Doug will select candidates for BC's entries.

# c) Guild Master William Huva – absent

John Matkovich discussed the BCGWJ (Guild). The mainland has about 9 attending members, Nanaimo about 10 and Victoria about 24. The 2023 Training Course did not have enough



applicants to cover expenses, so it was cancelled. The Guild still has sufficient judges to cover all competitions though.

### 6) Unfinished Business

### a) 2023 Provincial Crush – Mike Leeper

Each BCAWA Club was asked to select their first and second choice for the 2023 Crush. Representatives from each Club stated their preference. It was agreed that Carmenere was the popular choice for 2023.

The grapes will most likely come from Inland Desert WA. Clem Joyce has already talked to Jim Canil who thinks that he could supply 5,000 pounds. Rob Martino who can also supply grapes said that grapes would cost about \$2.00 to \$2.10 per pound.

VAWA mentioned that they prefer whole grapes. It was agreed that Mike Leeper would ask each Club to provide a guesstimate of their quantity by March 31<sup>st</sup>.

Ideally the grapes will be in sufficient quantity so that the Carmenere does not have to be rationed to each Club.

b) Proposed changes to determining Provincial Winemaker of the Year initiated by VAWA Larry McIntyre (VAWA) moved that BCAWA modify the rules for calculating the BC Grand Champion Winemaker. Instead of counting the scores of both wines in each class, only take the best score. Also give Best in Class (BIC) wines an extra point.

**Doug Markin (Nanaimo)** moved that BCAWA remove classes A – Aperitif Sherry, B – Aperitif and P – Sparkling Cider from the competition due to lack of use and reduced ability to find or train qualified judges.

d) Proposal to change the name of BCAWA

At the October 16, 2022 Annual General Meeting, the topic of changing the BCAWA name from: British Columbia Amateur Winemakers Association to: British Columbia Artisan Winemakers Association was brought up during the Town Hall session. After some discussion, Colin Nicolson (Saanich) moved to put this on the agenda for the next meeting to allow the club reps time to discuss with their clubs and be prepared to debate and vote on the topic.



John McMaster noted that as this is a motion to change the Association's Constitution, our Bylaws require that this must be presented as a Special Resolution and the member clubs must be given 30 days notice of a Special Resolution.

This Special Resolution will be introduced at the AGM on May 28, 2023 and the clubs will be given at least 30 days notice.

### e) 2023 Provincial Competition

John McMaster noted that Kamloops, Chilliwack and Langley are unable/unwilling to host in 2023. Saanich has confirmed 2024 and VAWA 2025. John, on behalf of BCAWA and Bill Huva on behalf of the Guild are proposing the 2023 Provincial Competition be jointly hosted by BCAWA/BCGWJ in May. Registration of entries would open April 8<sup>th</sup> and closes May 7<sup>th</sup>. The Competition results will be known by May 30<sup>th</sup>.
